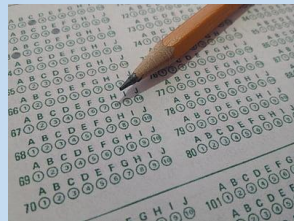

COMMUNITY SERVICE:

For this year 130 recorded community service hours are needed to receive a cord for graduation. It is always a great time to start helping out in your community. Volunteers are always needed.

Step 1: After you complete your Community Service, fill out the Community Service Supervisor Form & get required signature. Please make sure all information is filled in.

Step 2: Enter the service information into the Community Service Google Form.

Step 3: Once a month or as frequently as you like, please bring the signed Community Service Supervisor Form into Student Services or send it to ahiltenbrand@sd308.org.

Step 4: Turn in your Community Service Supervisor Form to Student Services

If you are volunteering for the same activity over an extended period of time, you only have to fill out the google form once for that activity and you will only need one supervisor signature to confirm the total number of hours. If you are volunteering for multiple activities, you will need to complete the google form for each activity along with the supervisor signature form.

You will not receive credit for hours if the above steps are not completed.

PLEASE do not wait until the last day of school to turn in your hours - turn them in monthly or as frequently as you can! **Seniors need to have their hours turned in by April 1st.**

Community Service is NOT a graduation requirement. However, it is recommended each student complete at least 25 hours of service. Those students who complete 130 hours or more of service during high school will earn an honor cord to be worn at graduation.

USING NAVIANCE TO MANAGE THE COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS: COMMON APP MATCHING, FERPA, TRANSCRIPTS, TEACHER/COUNSELOR RECOMMENDATION LETTERS, AND VIRTUAL COLLEGE VISITS

STEP 1: Create a Common Application Account and Complete the FERPA Waiver To request transcripts in Naviance, students must first create a Common App account and complete their FERPA (Family and Education Rights Privacy Act) waiver.

1. CREATE COMMON APP ACCOUNT

- Go to www.commonapp.org
- Click on **Create an Account**, then **First Year Student**
- Fill out the required fields and click **Create Account**
- Make sure you write down your **email and password**, do NOT use your school email – this email will be used again to match your Common App to Naviance
- Go to the **Common App tab** and click on **Education**
- Click on **Find School** and enter **Oswego East High School**
- Scroll down and click **Continue** (you can come back later to work on the application if you wish)

2. ADD A COLLEGE AND COMPLETE FERPA

- Go to the **College Search tab** and add **University of Illinois** (or a school you plan to apply to) to your college list by clicking the +
- Go to the **My Colleges tab** and then click on **University of Illinois** (or a school you plan to apply to)
- Click **Recommenders and FERPA** in the gray box
- Click **Complete Release Authorization**
- Read through the **Instructions** and click the **checkbox** showing that you understand the FERPA explanation and click **Continue**
- Click the **FERPA Form checkbox** to show that you understand your requested educational records and recommendations can be released to colleges for which you are applying
- Select **whether you DO or DO NOT waive your rights** to review all the recommendations and supporting documents submitted to colleges on your behalf - YOU CANNOT CHANGE THIS ONCE YOU ARE DONE (while we can not tell you what to choose, we can tell you that most students choose to waive their rights as they are asking for recommendations from teachers who they expect to get a positive recommendation from)
- Click the **checkbox** showing that you understand this decision can NOT be changed i) **Sign** and **date** and click **Save and Close**

3. IF YOU ADDED University of Illinois and it's not your college choice, DELETE IT

- Go to the **Dashboard tab**

- Click the **X** by University of Illinois to delete it from your Common App college list

STEP 2: Log into Naviance and match your Common App account

1. Go to student.naviance.com/oehs. Click on "Student." Click on "Clever." Click "Log in with Google." Your login information is your school username & password. 2. Under the **My Favorites** menu (the heart icon) click **Colleges I'm applying to** 3. Fill in the **Common App Email Address** box with the email address used when setting up the Common App account and double check your **Date of Birth**, then click **Match Accounts**

STEP 3: Request Transcripts

1. If you haven't done so already, complete the **Class of 2023 Senior Appointment Survey/Transcript Release Form**, located in **Planner** under **Tasks, Tasks Assigned to Me**.
2. From the Naviance home screen, under the **My Favorites menu (the heart icon)** click **Colleges I'm applying to**
3. Click the **+** in the red circle on the upper right of the screen
4. Select which college you are applying to and note how you are submitting your application (***NOTE: Be sure to select either *Direct to Institution* or *via Common App* - If the *I'm Not Sure Yet* option is selected, your Counselor will not be able to send your transcript until you update this option!**)
5. Click **Add and Request Transcript** when done

STEP 4: Request Teacher/Counselor Recommendation Letters

1. Check each college's website you are applying to see which require a Teacher or Counselor letter
2. If your colleges requires letter(s), send the Teacher(s)/Counselor an email to ask for a letter(s) of recommendation - thank them and let them know the deadlines for each of your colleges (it is courteous to give them 2 – 3 weeks notice)
3. **Counselors** have access to then upload your letter directly into Naviance with no extra steps on your part.
4. You must officially request the letter from **Teachers** through Naviance (Naviance sends teachers an email with instructions for uploading and sending the letters directly to colleges through Naviance)
 - a. From the Home screen under the **My Favorites menu (the heart icon)** click **Colleges I'm applying to**
 - b. Click **Letters of Recommendation Section** in the text
 - c. Click **Add Request**
 - d. Select a Teacher
 - e. Select which colleges you want the letter sent to
 - f. Leave the **personal note** section blank because you already emailed the teacher g. Click **Submit Request**
5. Complete the Letter of Recommendation Information Form via Naviance.
6. In the top right corner click on **About Me** then click **Surveys from your School**
 - a. Spend 15 – 20 minutes on this and then click **Save and Finish**
 - b. Teachers and Counselors can then access this information directly through Naviance

STEP 5: Sign up for College Admissions Rep Visits

1. From the Home screen under the **Colleges menu & Research Colleges** then click **College Visits**
2. Click **Register Now** if you are interested in attending, mark it on your calendar, let your teacher know you will miss class, and ask for any make-up work
3. A Zoom link for the visit will be posted in Naviance 15 minutes prior to the session 4. Attendance will be taken during the session and you will be responsible for making up any missed work.

Dear Class of 2023 Parents & Guardians,

Your student's senior year has begun! To assist your senior, Student Services staff would like to share some key information. A senior year timeline and a graduation credit check are included in this mailing.

Senior Presentation/College Fair/ College visits - On September 8th, counselors gave a senior presentation regarding how to send transcripts, complete online applications, request letters of recommendation, submit ACT/SAT scores, write essays, and submit other supplemental forms. Opposite this presentation all seniors participated in a College Fair in the Commons. Over 70 colleges and universities were represented. Military and trade school representatives were also present. Throughout the school year, all students have the opportunity to meet with various college, military, and career reps via our Naviance College Visits link.

Senior Credit Checks - A counselor will meet with each senior to discuss post high school plans and conduct a credit audit. Included in this correspondence is a form that notes which remaining classes your senior must successfully complete before graduation. The student is scheduled for these required classes. Please aid your student's success in these classes by regularly checking grades on Tyler and by communicating with teachers as needed.

Naviance, Transcripts, SAT/ACT Scores - Students have been trained, both in person and via email, on how to send transcripts via Naviance. **Please note that ACT and SAT scores** must be requested directly from ACT (www.actstudent.org) and SAT (www.collegeboard.org) when students complete college applications. Please contact Ms. Beamon (630) 636-2241 regarding transcript questions.

Scholarship and Financial Aid Information - Student Services emails the *Scholarship Newsletter* to our families via the Class of 2023 Student Services monthly senior email. This newsletter includes many current private, local, and national scholarships. It is updated for each publication. Information is also available on Naviance, the OEHS website, Twitter feed, Facebook Fan Page and Google Classroom.

Events - Additional events for parents are available throughout the year. These include FAFSA/financial aid information night, a FAFSA completion night, Conquering College Costs, etc. Information will be shared on the website, Twitter feed, Facebook Page, Google Classroom, through parent email, student school email, and the school newsletter. Dates are listed on the attached calendar.

FAFSA/Financial Aid Night is scheduled for September 19th from 6:30-7:30pm at Oswego East in the PAC. Although parents and students cannot begin to complete the FAFSA until October 1, a guest speaker from the Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC) will provide information which reviews this FREE application and prepares students and parents for FAFSA completion. Our ISAC representative, Maddie Haymond is available bi-monthly on Wednesdays in Student Services to meet with students starting on Sept 21st. Students can set up an appointment to meet with her through their counselor or Ms. Beamon in Student Services.

Communication is important - Student Services sends informational emails to students and parents throughout senior year. Please update your email with us if you are not receiving the emails. Visit the Student Services website www.sd308.org.oehs for pertinent information and the scholarship newsletter. Please contact your senior's counselor via email or phone if you have a question. **Students should check their school email accounts.**
